



HENDERSON'S TRAMLINE



Henderson's Tramline loop track follows the route of bush tramlines and haul lines once used to extract logs from the bush. The walk includes forest and clearings near the fringe of the park. A side track off the main walk leads down to the base of a waterfall and a large swimming hole.

How to Get There

Henderson's Tramline track is on Old Kaimai Road off State Highway 29.

Attractions and Facilities

Henderson's Tramline Loop Track
(Moderate walking, stream crossings, 4hrs return)

From the Tuakopae Stream Bridge the track runs through a clearing, past a junction with a side track to join the western branch of the Henderson Tramline. From the top of the tramline the track follows haul lines to a summit before turning north and continuing to a junction at the northern tramline. The track follows the tramline, then cuts through bush to run alongside a deer fence on the park boundary. The track crosses two tributaries of the Rataroa Stream before reaching Old Kaimai Road for the walk back to the start of the track. The stream crossings are not bridged, but are normally shallow enough to cross with care.

Car parking is provided at the start of the track.

There is a swimming hole below a waterfall on a side track a short distance from the start of the walk.

Please Remember

Horses, Vehicles (including bicycles and motorbikes), fires, removal of plants or animals, and hunting without a permit are not permitted. No dogs are permitted except for hunting, with a current permit.
